CALL TO ORDER AND ROLL CALL

1. This meeting was called to order by Speaker Douglass at 2:05pm in the HSC (Holmes Student Center) Sky Room.

PUBLIC COMMENTS

1. Speaker Douglass asks Sid Kincaid to the stand.
2. Sid Kincaid states
 - a. "Good afternoon.
 - b. My name is Sid Kincaid. I am an alum and former SA senator.

- c. I'm here today because I saw a Northern Star article this week which stated that another alum, Jacob Burg, had given public comment to this Senate criticizing what he saw as a lack of transparency and hasty decision making during meetings... citing meeting minutes being uploaded late and failures to pass legislation that he claims would have held senators accountable.
- d. In 2015 I brought this Senate to court after the Speaker and Deputy Speaker told the Northern Star that they do not need to comply with the open meetings act because they are not a public body. This case was eventually settled, but not before the Senate was forced to answer the complaint in which they admitted that they are a public body. I then spent a couple years after that filing numerous FOIA requests for all of the meeting minutes, legislation, director reports, and even emails. While the reason for my actions were to ensure compliance with transparency law, my motivation was due to the utter failure of the student association to accurately represent the interests of the student body. This culminated in a letter I sent to university council detailing the dominance that a handful of greek houses held in both the executive and legislative branches. When the pandemic hit, I made the decision to divert my attention away from these efforts as both myself and everyone else had to invest their time in other ways for the sake of safety and protecting livelihoods. Since the world has now returned to normal, and seeing this evidence of possible non-compliance returning to the SGA's practices, I now have to ask myself whether I need to act again.
- e. So, today I want to reiterate to you the importance of compliance with the state's transparency laws, the Open Meetings Act and the Freedom of Information Act.
- f. #1. It is the law.
- g. Many citizens and government officials take these laws very seriously. During the period in which I was collecting records from this student government, I was also sending FOIA requests to other universities and had to file another lawsuit against CSU's student government. They ignored my FOIA request, ignored service of summons, and ignored the courts orders when default judgement was awarded, which then led the judge to issue a warrant for arrest. A police officer had to be

sent out with cuffs ready before the student government realized the gravity of the situation and finally complied.

- h. #2. For the sake of your own education.
- i. What ultimately persuaded me in favor of filing my suit was the realization that the Open Meetings Act requires training for all who are subject to it. This would not only prepare senators for their role as decision makers, but also as citizens when they graduate and go into their field. Knowledge of these laws is an important tool to be informed regarding the affairs of government and policies of those who represent them as public officials. So that, yes, with a little bit of knowledge you too can sue your government.
- j. #3 For your own history. To ensure trust with constituents and the community.
- k. Production and maintenance of accurate records and meeting minutes is necessary to ensure that the decisions made by the Senate will be implemented and understood by future sessions.

What this bill does is it creates a way to automatically update the constituency seats there is a minimum and a maximum the maximum is 75 that was chosen because at one point there was roughly double the amount of students going to US there are now and that is roughly double the amount of seats are currently here this one is the one that I'm most of them change as 75 is quite high the minimum was chosen so that each college would always have one seat as well as housing and at large would have one seed as well as each underserved student center having one seat it also requires when the Board of Elections meets for the first time that they would have to update the number of seats this shouldn't be too hard because they already have to meet anyway.
